The Sundial

The Sundial, located on the Ohio State University Oval between the Main Library and University Hall, was a memorial gift to the University from the Class of 1905. Standing on the 40th parallel and within a few rods of the 85th meridian, the bronze Sundial rests atop a classic column of white Georgia marble. In its original construction, the Sundial measured both sun time and central standard time. In the early days of the century. it was moved to the front of University Hall, then to the center of the Oval on the Long Walk. Although it bears the marks of weather and age. the Sundial remains a treasured campus landmark and stands today on its original site as a durable symbol of time and change on The Ohio State. University campus.
